விளைவுகள் இன்னமும் தமிழர் தாயகத்தில் வியாபித்து காணப்படுகிறது. வடக்கு கிழக்கு மற்றும் மலையகத்தில் பல காப்பகங்கள் சிறுவர் மூத்தோர் மற்றும் விசேட தேவையுள்ளோரை பராமரித்த வண்ணமுள்ளது. இயற்கை அனர்த்தங்களும் சமூக பொருளாதார காரணிகளும் இவை தொடர்ந்து இருப்பதற்கான தேவையை உண்டாக்குகின்றன. இவையனைத்தும் பொது மக்களின், பொது அமைப்புக்களின் நன்கொடைகளிலேயே தங்கியுள்ளன. ஆனாலும், காப்பகங்கள் பற்றிய புரிதலும் அவற்றின் தேவைகள் பற்றிய அறிதலும் மிகக் குறைவாகவே காணப்படுகிறது.

More than a decade has passed since the end of war, yet the effects of the war persist throughout the Tamil homeland. Children, elders and special needs people are still at care homes in North, East and Upcountry. Natural disasters, economic and social determinants have entrenched the need for sustained support for those affected. The care homes, community networks and community services organizations depend on public donations for their operations. Yet, there is limited awareness and understanding about these organizations.

LetUsHelpNow began as an initiative to directly help and bring awareness to children, elderly and special needs care homes, community networks and agencies serving vulnerable people in North, East and Upcountry of Sri Lanka. It was started in July 2018 by a small group of volunteers in diaspora and in Sri Lanka.

LetUsHelpNow Foundation is a registered not-for-profit (12031167) organization in Canada, and has contributors and directors from Australia, United Kingdom, and Sri Lanka. We welcome collaborations and contributions from all.

Objectives

- Promote and bring awareness about organizations that provide shelter, food and care to children, the elderly and people with special needs.
- Provide direct assistance through monthly projects that improve the lives of the people served by care homes and community agencies.
- Facilitate connection among care homes, community agencies, diaspora and service organizations.

இலங்கையில் கோவிட்-19 தொற்றின் பின்னரான காலப் பகுதியில் தன்னர்வ தொண்டு நிறுவனங்களின் காப்பகங்கள் முன்னைய காலப்பகுதியை விட மேலும் புதிய சாவால்களை சந்தித்தன. குறிப்பாக உள்ளக நன்கொடையாளர்களின் நன்கொடைகளும், நாளாந்த உணவுக் கொடைகளும் பெருமளவில் குறைந்தே காணப்பட்டன. அதே நேரத்தில் காப்பக பயன்பெறுவோரின் எண்ணிக்கையும் கணிசமாக அதிகரித்து இருந்தது.

அறம் செய்வோம் அறக்கட்டளையினது 2022ம் மாதாந்த செயற்றிட்டங்கள் மூலம் வடக்கு கிழக்கு மற்றும் மலையக பகுதிகளை உள்ளடக்கிய 12 மாவட்டங்களிலுள்ள 52 காப்பகங்களையும், 4 வலையமைப்புக்களையும், தமிழ்நாட்டிலுள்ள ஈழத்தமிழர் ஒரு அகதி முகாமையும் சார்ந்த 2500+ சிறுவர்கள், மூத்தோர்கள், சிறப்புத் தேவையுள்ளவர்கள் பயன் பெற்றார்கள்.

15.5 மில்லியன் ரூபா பெறுமதியான அத்தியாவசிய செயற்றிட்டங்களை கனடா அவுஸ்திரேலியா மற்றும் பிரித்தானிய நன்கொடையாளர்களது தொடர்ச்சியான மாதாந்த சிறு நன்கொடைகள் மூலம் நிறைவு செய்யக்கூடியதாக இருந்தது. அதிலும் எமது நிர்வாகச்செலவாக 1 வீதத்திற்கு குறைவான நிதியே செலவு செய்யப்பட்டது. அதுவும் பண பரிமாற்றம் மற்றும் வங்கிச் செலவானவே இருந்தது. நன்கொடையாளர்களது 99 வீதமான நிதியும் பயனர்களுக்கு பயன்படும் விதமாவே உபயோகிக்கப்பட்டது. அறக்கட்டளையினது அனைத்து செயல் வினைகளும் தன்னார்வளர்களின் ஒன்றினைந்த முயற்சி ஆகும். அத்துடன் சர்வதேச நிதி நெருக்கடி நேரங்களிலும் நன்கொடையாளர்ளின் நிதிப்பஙகளிப்பு சீரானதாகவே இருந்தது.

இந்த ஆண்டு மாதாந்த கூட்டங்கள் மாதத்தின் இரண்டாவது சனிக்கிழமைகளில் நடைபெற்று, திட்டங்கள் பற்றி கலந்தாலோசிக்கப்பட்டன. அத்துடன் ஆண்டுச்சந்திப்பும் ஆண்டு இறுதியில் நடைபெற்றது.

விளிம்புநிலை முகமறியா எம் தாயக உறவுகளின் வாழ்வில் சற்றேனும் ஒரு நேர்மைறையான ஒரு திருப்பத்தினை கொண்டு வருவதற்காக தொடரச்சியாக தன்னலமற்ற உதவிகளை வழங்கிவரும் நன்கொடையாளர்கள், புலத்திலே பணிகளை நிறைவேற்றிவரும் தொண்டர்கள், சமூக அக்கரையுள்ளவர்கள், காப்பக அறங்காவலர்கள், நிர்வாகிகள் அனைவருக்கும் எம் சிரம் தாழ்த்திய நன்றிகள்.

2022 Year in Review

In 2022, in the aftermath of COVID-19, Sri Lanka experienced a deep economic and political crisis, culminating in the Aragalaya protests. The inflation increased several folds, and there was shortage of food, medicine, and other supplies. Donations to care homes significantly reduced, while, simultaneously, the number of people in care homes increased.

In 2022, the LetUsHelpNow Foundation's monthly projects assisted over 2500 children, elders, and people with special needs. These projects benefited 52 care homes and 4 support networks, covering 12 districts in the North, East, and Up Country. Furthermore, we assisted one Sri Lankan Tamil refugee camp in India. The total value of the projects completed in 2022 was 15.5 million Sri Lankan rupees. This was made possible by continuous small donations from our kind donors in Canada, Australia, the United Kingdom, and Sri Lanka.

Administrative expenses accounted for less than 1% of the total, covering money exchange and bank expenses. 99% of the donors' funds were used towards projects that benefited people in need. Despite the global economic crisis, our donors continued their support. Our work is made possible by the contributions of selfless volunteers and donors.

Some of the highlights of 2022 include:

- Supporting the establishment of home gardens and animal husbandry at 25 care homes
- Ezhuka, a capability-building project by the LetUsHelpNow Foundation. Through this initiative, we organize workshops and training sessions to enhance the capabilities of caregivers for children with special needs. We supported two multi-day workshops at Ozanam (Batticaloa) and ORHAN (Vavuniya).
- LetUsHelpNow is supporting a mentorship program at Bhavanisagar High School in Erode, located near the Bhavanisagar refugee camp, benefiting 350 students.
- Building and/or improving washrooms and playrooms to accommodate children with special needs.

This year, monthly meetings took place on the second Saturday of every month. The meetings are open to all. The discussions, review and feedback strengthen the projects' outcomes. The annual gathering for 2022 was held on December 10th.

Our heartfelt thanks to the socially conscious donors, volunteers, care home trustees, and administrators in Sri Lanka and in the diaspora for their kindness and support.

நேரடியாக உதவிகளை வழங்கும் செயற்பாட்டு மாதிரியை LetUsHelpNow முன்னிறுத்துகிறது. தகவல்களை வழங்கி, உதவ முன்வருபவர்களை இல்லங்களுடன் நேரடியாக தொடர்புகொள்ள நாம் ஊக்குவிக்கிறோம். மேலும், இல்லங்களின் தேவைகளை அறிந்து நேரடியாக மாதாந்த செயற்திட்டங்கள் ஊடாக உதவிகளை வழங்கி வருகிறோம். இந்த மாதாந்த செயற்திட்டங்கள் பின்வரும் படிநிலைகளைக் கொண்டுள்ளன: தேவையறிதல், நிதிசேகரித்தல், செயற்திட்டம் நடைமுறைப்படுத்தல், நிதி விபரம் மற்றும் வெளிப்படைத்தன்மை பேணல்.

தேவையறிதல்

அறம் செய்வோம் அறக்கட்டளையின் மாதாந்த செயற்திட்டங்களின் முதல் கட்டம் தேவையறிதல் ஆகும். இலங்கையிலுள்ள பராமரிப்பு இல்லங்கள், வலையமைப்புக்கள், சமூக சேவை நிறுவனங்களோடு நாம் வாட்ஸ்அப் குழுக்கள், நேரடி உரையாடல்கள், செயற்திட்ட கூட்டுச் செயற்பாடுகள் ஊடாக தொடர்ச்சியான தொடர்பில் இருக்கிறோம். தேவைப்படும் பொழுது சூம் சந்திப்புக்கள் ஊடாகவும் ஒரு பிரதேசத்தில் உள்ள இல்லங்களின் தேவைகளை நாம் கேட்டறிகிறோம். மேலும், உள்ளூர் அரச அலுவர்கள், தன்னார்வலர்களோடும் நாம் இணைந்து செயற்படுகிறோம். இத்தகைய உரையாடல்கள் ஊடாக முக்கிய தேவைகளை அடையாளம் காண்கிறோம்.

தேவைகளின் காரணங்களும் அவற்றிற்கான அண்ணளவான நிதித்தேவைகளும் கண்டறியப்படுகின்றது. உள்ளூர் அரச அலுவர்கள், துறைசார் வல்லுனர்கள் உட்பட்ட பல தரப்பட்டவர்களில் உள்ளீடு பெறப்பட்டு செயற்திட்டம் பற்றிய விரிவான கலந்துரையாடல்களை எமது மாதாந்த சந்திப்பில் மேற்கொள்கிறோம். இந்த திறந்த சந்திப்பில் அனைவரையும் பங்கேற்க வரவேற்கிறோம். எமது நிதிவளம், தேவைகளின் அவசரத்தன்மைகள் இல்லங்களிலுள்ளவர்களின் எண்ணிக்கை, செயற்திட்டம் நிறைவேற்றப்படுவதற்கான சாத்தியக்கூறுகள் என்பவற்றிற்கு ஏற்ப மாதத்திற்கு ஒரு திட்டம் அல்லது ஒன்றுக்கு மேற்பட்ட திட்டங்கள் அனுமதி பெறுகின்றன.

நிதிசேகரித்தல்

மாதாந்த நன்கொடையாளர்களிடம் செயற்றிட்டம் மற்றும் இல்லம் பற்றிய விபரங்கள் பகிரப்படுகிறது.

செயற்கிட்டம் நடைமுறைப்படுத்தல்

இல்லங்களிடமிருந்து தேவைகளுக்கான பொருட்களை வாங்குவதற்கான ஆகக்குறைந்த இரண்டு விலைகோரல்கள் பெறப்பட்டு கலந்தாலோசித்து தெரிவு நடைபெறுகிறது.

உத்தேசிக்கப்பட்ட நிதியானது மாத இறுதிக்குள் மூன்று நாடுகளிலிருந்தும் சேகரிக்கப்பட்டு, இல்லங்களின் வங்கிக்கணக்கிற்கு நேரடியாகவோ அல்லது இலங்கையிலுள்ள பொதுக் கணக்கிற்கோ அனுப்பப்படுகிறது. இலங்கையிலுள்ள பொது கணக்கில் வைப்பிலிடப்படும் நிதியானது, பின் இல்லங்களின் வங்கிக்கணக்கிற்கு அனுப்பப்படுகிறது. இல்லங்கள் தேவையான பொருட்களை விலைமதிப்பு கோரப்பட்ட இடங்களிலிருந்து பெறப்பட்டு தேவைகளை நிவர்த்திசெய்கின்றன.

நிதி விபரம் மற்றும் வெளிப்படைத்தன்மை பேணல்

இல்லங்கள் தமக்கு வழங்கப்பட்ட நிதிக்கான பற்றுச்சீட்டு, பொருட்கள் கொள்வனவு செய்த பற்றுச்சீட்டுகள், கொள்வனவு செய்யப்பட்ட பொருட்களின் புகைப்படங்கள் மற்றும் அவை அனைத்தையும் குறிப்பிட்டு ஒருசிறு நன்றிக்கடிதம் என்பவற்றை வழங்குகின்றன.

இவை அனைத்தும் நன்கொடையாளர்களிடம் அவ்வப்போதே பகிரப்படுகின்றது. செயல் திட்ட நிறைவில் அனைத்து விபரங்களும் இணைத்தள செயல் திட்ட பக்கத்திலும் முகநூற் பக்கத்திலும் பகிரப்படுகிறது.

Our.Process

Action MODEL.

LetUsHelpNow advocates for a direct assistance community action model. We provide information about care homes that donors can directly engage with to donate and/or provide other support. Further, LetUsHelpNow undertakes targeted direct assistance through monthly projects to fulfill major urgent needs in care homes. Each project has the following life cycle: Needs Assessment, Project Planning, Fundraising, Project Delivery, and Finance and Transparency.



Needs Assessment

The first step of LetUsHelpNow's monthly project's life cycle is Need Assessment. We are in constant contact with care homes through our WhatsApp groups, direct conversations, and project collaborations. We hold periodic meetings with care homes as well. We collaborate with local government units and volunteers as well. Through these discussions, we identify priority needs.

LetUsHelpNow assesses the needs and the reasons for the requests. We determine the funding required as well as how the project can be delivered. The assessment includes direct communication with homes, input from local regulatory agencies, and input from our advisors and donors. Factors such as the number of beneficiaries, the urgency of the request, fit with our focus and capacities, are considered for deciding upon a project. These deliberations take place at our monthly meetings. All are welcome to attend these open meetings.

Fundraising

The project description and details of the homes are shared with our small group of monthly donors. The small donations are collected by country co-ordinators.

Project Delivery

Majority of projects involve purchase and delivery of materials. LetUsHelpNow requests minimum two quotations from the care homes. Further, it seeks out other input regarding selecting the supplier. The funds are directly sent to the homes bank accounts. Homes make the purchases and provide receipts, thank you letters and pictures.

In some cases, LetUsHelpNow volunteers assist with the purchase and delivery of the materials. Further, volunteers go to the homes to verify the delivery of the material

Finance and Transparency

Majority of projects involve purchase and delivery of materials. For each project, the homes provide request letters, quotations, the receipt for the donation, the receipts for the materials, the pictures of the materials and a thank you letter listing the materials. Further, donation and transaction details are documented. These are collected and published online at our website as well as other communication channels such as WhatsApp and Facebook.

அறம் செய்வோம் அறக்கட்டளை தனது பணிகளை மாதாந்த செயற்திட்டங்கள் ஊடாக முதன்மையாக முன்னெடுக்கிறது. இந்தப் பணிகளை நாம் சிறுவர்கள், மூத்தோர், சிறப்புத் தேவையுள்ளவர்களுக்கு சேவையாற்றும் காப்பகங்கள், வலையமைப்புக்கள், சமூக சேவை நிறுவனங்களோடு இணைந்து மேற்கொள்கிறோம். மாதாந்தம், மலையகம், கிழக்கு, வடக்கு என்று சுழற்சி முறையில் செயற்திட்டங்கள் நிறைவேற்றப்படுகின்றன.

எமது செயற்பாடுகளை பின்வரும் பிரிவுகளாக அணுகலாம்: அவசரகால உதவி, அடிப்படைத் தேவைகள் உதவி, நூலகம்-கலைகள்-விளையாட்டுத் துறைகளை ஆதரித்தல், கல்வி மற்றும் திறன் மேம்பாடு, நிலைத்தன்மை ஊக்குவிப்பு மற்றும் அவசிய உட்கட்டமைப்பு மேம்பாடு.

2022 இல், 15.4 மில்லியன் இலங்கை ரூபா பெறுமதியான, 30 செயற்திட்டங்கள், 12 மாவட்டங்களில் நிறைவேற்றப்பட்டன. இவற்றின் ஊடாக 52 காப்பகங்களையும், 4 வலையமைப்புக்களையும், ஒரு அகதி முகாமையும் சார்ந்தவர்கள் என கிட்டத்தட்ட 1,500 பயனர்கள் பயன் பெற்றார்கள்.

Monthly Projects Overview


The LetUsHelpNow Foundation primarily carries out its activities via monthly projects. We collaborate with care homes, community networks and agencies serving children, elders, and special needs people. The projects are rotated by region from Upcountry, East to North.

Our work broadly focuses on the following sectors: Crisis Relief, Basic Needs Assistance, Promoting Library, Arts & Sports, Education and Capacity Building, Supporting Sustainability and Infrastructure Improvement.

In 2022, we implemented 30 projects, worth 15.4 million Sri Lankan rupees. This benefitted more than 52 care homes and 2 community networks in 12 districts, serving 1500+ children, elders and special needs people.



by Sector




Project Summary FUND DISTRIBUTION.

by Home Type




by Donation Type



Covid-19 pandemic, economic crisis and political unrest have devastated Sri Lanka, impacting the vulnerable populations the hardest. The food, medicine, energy and educational supply costs have increased by multiple folds. At the same time, the local support and donations the care homes received have decreased.

LetUsHelpNow distributed dry-food to alleviate the food crisis. In addition, we focused on projects that can reduce expenses and bring in income or reduce expenses through our sustainability projects.

Education and capacity building are fundamental to quality of lives. Education provides an increased awareness about the world and opportunities around us. From nutrition, financial literacy, human rights, to communication skills, the knowledge and skills are essential to navigate and succeed in life. Lifelong learning and capacity building are needed to continuously improve our communities.

LetUsHelpNow undertook various projects to support education and capacity building. We provided educational supplies to care home students. We supported training for special needs caregivers, teachers and parents. We supported a mentorship program for Sri Lankan Tamil refugee students in Tamil Nadu. We facilitated volunteers in the diaspora to deliver courses and workshops to people at care homes and outside.

CAPABILITY BUILDING WORKSHOP FOR SPECIAL NEEDS CAREGIVERS



Ezhuka is a capability building project by LetUsHelpNow Foundation. Through this initiative, we help organize workshops and training sessions to improve the capability of the caregivers of special needs children. The aim is to improve the capability of the caregivers to better evaluate and understand the needs of special needs children and to serve the personal, educational, and career development of those children.

The first two workshops in this series were held in collaboration with Victory Special Study Center. They have extensive expertise and experience in providing training for parents and caregivers of special needs children. Nithyakalyani is the founder of the Victory Special Study Center. She is a dedicated special education administrator with over eighteen years of experience developing and implementing programs that support the academic and social-emotional needs of the students with special needs. In addition, special education teachers from the Victory Special Study Center led the workshops. Nandhini is a clinical psychotherapist. She was the honorary president of the Asian Federation on Intellectual Disabilities among many other roles. She also led the first workshop.

The first workshop was delivered over three days to caregivers at Ozanam, and to teachers at Mencafep on September 15 to 17 2022. First the trainers observed the daily activities of the caregivers, administrators and the children in Ozanam. They assessed each child individually. Then, tailored and delivered the workshop accordingly. Various types of training that help encourage physical, social, emotional, linguistic and cognitive development were delivered. A key takeaway was the need to individually understand the challenges and capabilities of each child and to deliver an individualized education and care program. An individualized care plan for each child at the Ozanam center was developed and shared with the caregivers. Trainers provided guidance to promote independence, for example in daily routines. Similar types of training was delivered at Mencafep.

The second workshop was held at the Organization for Rehabilitation of the Handicapped (ORHAN) in Vavuniya in October. The workshop engaged four teachers serving 40 special needs children. Various topics were taken up during the workshops, including developing activity based curriculum, developing capacity using play and teamwork, engaging children through festivals, reducing distractions in the classroom, and differentiating between good and bad touch. Further, a training session was organized for the parents of the special needs children. Topics covered during the session for the parents include scheduling daily activities, engaging children in daily routines, engaging siblings in the care of the special needs children, hygiene, toilet training, nutrition, obesity, and mental health. As an example of home based vocation training, a demonstration about producing incense was shown.

Our thanks and appreciation to Victory Special Study Center, Ozanam, Mencafep and ORHAN in making these workshops successful. We hope to deliver this type of workshop to other care homes in North, East and Upcountry in Sri Lanka.

MENTORING PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS AT TAMIL NADU REFUGEE CAMPS



Since 1983, waves of Sri Lankan Tamil refugees have been coming to Tamil Nadu, fleeing the war and persecution in Sri Lanka. As of 2022, there were 58,843 Sri Lankan Tamil refugees, residing in 108 camps in 29 districts. There were 34,135 refugees living outside of the camps. These refugees in and outside of the camps face immense legal, social and economic hardships. For instance, they must register their attendance with the camp, cannot undertake higher studies, and have limited job prospects. Researchers and refugee agencies have noted that the Tamil refugees are treated like criminals. Higher incidence of suicides is a sad indicator of the extreme conditions endured by the refugees.

Though a recent court ruling by the Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court may open the pathways to citizenship, that will not be realized in practice for many years, if ever. In its ruling, the court noted that "Keeping them under surveillance and severely restricted conditions and in a state of statelessness for such a long period certainly offends their right under Article 21 of the Constitution of India."

Due to these oppressive conditions and disadvantaged environment, many refugee students are unmotivated and demoralized to pursue education. Community leaders from the Bhavanisagar Refugee Camp identified this as a major challenge to overcome. They proposed a mentorship project to motivate and guide the students, to introduce them to higher learning and job prospects and to build their capabilities.

Bhavanisagar Refugee Camp consists of approximately 1,000 families (around 3,800 family members). A nearby school primarily serves students from this refugee camp. This mentorship project was designed as an after school program for all students from that school. About 350 students are currently benefiting from the program.

LetUsHelpNow Foundation is supporting this mentorship program as a pilot project. Currently, three mentors with the support of two teachers are undertaking this program at the school. It runs every other week for six days. Students are divided into smaller groups and participate in different days.

The curricula for the after school program was largely designed by the mentors from the Bavanisagar camp, with some input from LetUsHelpNow. It is a play based interactive approach, designed to encourage student participation and expression. The students receive a snack during the session as well. The students' grades before and after the program, as well as other feedback and indicators will be used to evaluate the program.


Currently, each mentor receives a INR 500 honorarium for each session. The monthly cost for the honorarium is INR 18,000 (INR 500 per session x 12 sessions x 3 mentors). In addition, there is INR 5,000 snack expenses. Thus, the overall budget for this pilot mentorship initiative is INR 138,000.

We hope that this pilot project will guide the students to build a better future. We hope to strengthen our relationships with community leaders and volunteers at Bavanisagar refugee camp, as well as other camps to continue our collaborations. We hope to contribute to improving the awareness about the plight of the Sri Lankan Tamil refugees in Tamil Nadu among the diaspora, as well as in Tamil Nadu.

COURSES AND WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS - Theatre of the Oppressed Virtual Workshop



Theatre of the Oppressed Virtual Workshop was organized and delivered by Sathya and Suba to about 15 children from the Thilahavathiyar Girls Home, (Kathiraveli, Batticaloa). The workshop consisted of six sessions of about 90 minutes. Theatre of the Oppressed is a form of interactive theater invented by Augusto Boal in the 1970s. It invites the performers to explore, show, analyze and transform the reality in which they are living. It has been used as a tool for educational, artistic, and social engagement. Each session started with warm-ups with progressive activites to get the participants to get comfortable performing in front of others. Once the children gained confidence, they moved into a main activity. Each session ended with a brief summary. Name game, counting to 20, leading, animal characters, cabin in the woods were some of the theater games and activities incorporated into the workshop.

Theatre of the Oppressed activities allow the participants to tackle real-life situations. They are designed to address social issues and inspire action for change. Though there were disruptions due to power cuts, the children participated enthusiastically. Some of our lessons learned related to organizing this type of virtual workshops include: having a small group to allow for meaningful participation from each participant, having the same age group, ensuring that appropriate devices such as screen, speakers etc are available, and having alternative arrangements in the case of power cuts. Thank you to Sathya for bringing Theatre of the Oppressed to the children at the Thilahavathiyar Girls Home, as well as to the wider community.

COURSES AND WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS - Dance Virtual Workshop



A key objective of LetUsHelpNow is to connect the diaspora with care homes and community networks in North, East and Upcountry. We were happy to link youth from the Canadian Tamil Youth Alliance (CTYA) with Ladani Girls' Child Development Centre (Mullaitivu). They have started offering online dance classes to the children from the care home. Currently, eight children are participating in the virtual dance class.

COURSES AND WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS-SUPPORTING THE MULTI SKILLS DEVELOPMENT PROJECT









HOPE is a Trincomalee based organization dedicated to helping persons with disabilities. Their vision is "an inclusive society providing the persons with disabilities a dignified life with ample equal opportunity in the community". One of the main projects they undertook before COVID was the Multi Skills Development project.

The project engaged persons with disabilities and their parents via an afternoon program. It developed the skills of the students through various activities and training, including drama, play therapy, yoga, gardening, handicrafts, computer lessons and daily living activities. The program was delivered by teachers who had knowledge and skills in working with differently-abled people, including to delivering physiotherapy, and counseling. Further, they sought to provide assistance such as transportation to the beneficiaries to ensure that all are able to participate in the program. About 20 - 30 beneficiaries participated in the program at any given time.

The project was paused due to COVID. LetUsHelpNow Foundation provided funds to restart the project. This is an ongoing support provided by LetUsHelpNow.

Infrastructure Improvement



Beneficiaries: 2 Care Homes

Budget: Rs. 0.78 M

Infrastructure wants and needs of care homes can vary. Often, e ssential maintenance, repairs and improvements are needed. Care homes may not have the budget to undertake even the basic repairs such as repairing washrooms.

As a small organization, LetUsHelpNow does not fund any infrastructure development, except for urgent repairs, and improvements that address Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) related concerns.

Infrastructure Improvement

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)




Canaan Harvest Children's Home (Badulla, Uva Province) cares for 38 female children. They had three washrooms to serve them all. One of them was badly damaged and in dire condition. It was causing bad smells and hygiene concerns. As these washrooms were near living areas, the home administrators wanted to address this issue urgently. Further, they wanted to build additional washrooms away from the living areas to meet their needs.

LetUsHelpNow Foundation's Upcountry coordinator and Bandarawela municipal council commissioner Gajan Thanaraj and one Bandarawela municipal council technical officer visited the care home to assess the need and the proposed solution. Based on their feedback as well as the home's input, LetUsHelpNow decided to support the home to repair the damaged washroom as well as building three new washrooms away from the living areas.

LetUsHelpNow provided two thirds of the funds to do the repair and to build three new washrooms at Canaan Harvest Children's Home.

Infrastructure Improvement

URGENT REPAIRS



St.Francis Child Development Centre (Matale, Central province) cares for 15 children. During the rainy season, they requested repair of windows as well as repair of some electrical wiring. We provided assistance to undertake the repair of urgent electrical works.

Library, Arts and Sports



Beneficiaries: 3 Care Homes


Budget: Rs. 1.5 M

Literature, arts, music, and sports enrich our lives. They are essential for physical, mental and emotional health. These activities provide recreation, as well as help improve creativity and communications skills. Due to resource constraints as well as cultural factors, libraries, arts and sports are often not well used at care homes.

LetUsHelpNow promotes library, arts and sports by providing equipment, improving facilities, and by providing opportunities to partake in these activities. In 2022, we provided input as well as feedback to transform the playroom used by special needs children at the Organization for Rehabilitation of the Handicapped (Vavuniya). We collaborated with Noolaham Foundation in the Audio Books project. We purchased and distributed ten Braille Books for homes and libraries for the visually impaired.

Library, Arts and Sports

AUDIO BOOKS



Access to educational Tamil materials is a major challenge faced by visually impaired students in Sri Lanka. In collaboration with Noolaham Foundation, LetUsHelpNow is helping to create audio books. For 2022, the focus has been to record textbooks used by university students in the fields of arts, media, law and political science. As of January 2023, the audio books project will have 1000 recordings. These recordings can be accessed at aavanaham.org/islandora/object/noolaham:audio_books.

A discussion about audio books and needs of the visually impaired was held on Oct 15. Students and administrators from Vaazhvakam and Dharisanam as well as others participated in the discussion. Some of the feedback from the meeting follows:

Provide audio books recordings not by chapters, but as a complete work.

Provide easily accessible websites to find the recordings.

Upload the recordings to youtube for easier use.

Compile list of existing recordings, resources as well as needed resources.

Library, Arts and Sports

PLAYROOM IMPROVEMENT



Puth Vazhvu Poonga school for special needs children (Vavuniya) provides education for 72 children. The school is run by the Organization for Rehabilitation of the Handicapped (ORHAN), which has been serving the special needs community of the Northern province since 1999. Currently, ORHAN consists of 460 members. The school provides special education and training, including sign language training, speech training and vocational training. It provides supporting services, including physical therapy, yoga and sports.

LetUsHelpNow assisted in upgrading the playroom to benefit the diverse beneficiaries at the home. The playroom walls were beautifully painted with engaging murals. Windows were replaced. New furniture, floor mats and television were provided. More importantly, new play equipment, including play setup for visually impaired children were set up.


A simple opening ceremony was held on 23/03/2002. Children, parents, ORHAN home's administrators, stewards and community leaders participated in the event. The playroom was opened by Theepikan, a student of the home. Several trees were planted at the conclusion of the event by children and guests.

The budget for the January project was LKR 1,000,000. The funds were donated by 103 LetUsHelpNow contributors from Canada, Australia and the United Kingdom. The transformed playroom photos, receipts and thank you letters provided by the home were shared with the donors and published online.



BRAILLE BOOKS



Educators for visually impaired students stress the importance of Braille to develop full literacy. Braille represents letters by raised dots and can be read by touch. It allows the visually impaired to learn "spelling, grammar and punctuation and gain an understanding of how text is formatted on the page".

[1] The Tamil Braille is the same with minor differences in both Sri Lanka and India. LetUsHelpNow purchased ten Braille books, each containing three stories from thumbigal.com, and distributed them to visually impaired schools and public libraries in Northern and Eastern provinces in Sri Lanka.

Supporting Sustainability



Beneficiaries: 35 Care Homes

Budget: Rs. 5 M

Operational sustainability and stability are important for people at care homes as well as staff and volunteers helping administer these homes. As institutions of last resort, these homes do not receive appropriate levels of support from the government or the larger society. Initiatives that reduce expenses, generate income, and enhance the living environment help improve the financial and environmental sustainability of care homes.

LetUsHelpNow focused on four types of projects to support sustainability: home gardening, poultry farming, assisting setting up of small businesses, and implementing solar panels.

Supporting Sustainability

HOME GARDENING



In 2022, Sri Lanka was devastated by a deep economic and political crisis. The food production was disturbed by the fertilizer ban and lack of fuel/electricity. This caused rapid food inflation, food shortage and food insecurity. Home gardens help mitigate the food crisis, and help build sustainability. Further, gardening can provide opportunities to learn about nature/agriculture as well as improve wellbeing.

LetUsHelpNow undertook several projects to assist home gardening at care homes and at homes of vulnerable people through a community network. We assisted more than 26 homes in the East and Upcountry to set up home gardens. A collaborative discussion with care homes in Eastern homes was held on June 9th, 2022 about gardening. More than 20 people shared their experiences as well as challanges with home gardening. We documented and shared lessons learned (https://letushelpnow.org/resources), as well as connected homes with related authorities (Ministry of Agriculture, Eastern Province) in the field.

We assisted WE-CAN (wecan-sl.org) to provide a home garden kit consisting of 50 plants (tomato, eggplant, okra, chillies, banana peppers), 10 Kg compost and spade (one for every four families) to 300 differently abled families. WE-CAN (wecan-sl.org) is a community network serving the differently abled people in Manthai west divisional secretariat, Mannar, Northern province. Many of its members have lost limbs or got injured during the war. The plants and compost were produced by WE-CAN itself, and it engaged three differently abled people as staff for three months to assist the families in setting up the home garden.

Most homes reported good experience and results in implementing home gardens. Several homes shared their produce with their neighbors, and some even generated small income from the surplus produce. From engaging people hands-on in a creative endeavor to helping alleviate the food crisis, home gardening is a good project model to build skills and sustainability.

Supporting Sustainability

POULTRY FARMING



In addressing the food crisis in Sri Lanka, LetUsHelpNow supported setting up poultry farming in several care homes. Poultry farming provides an accessible source of protein via eggs and meat. It can also contribute to revenue generation. We provided funds to set up the chicken coop, to purchase chicks, and initial poultry feed.

Several challanges were encountered in setting up poultry farms. First, due to the economic crisis, it was difficult to purchase chicks and poultry feed. Second, ongoing power cuts meant that chicks could not be hatched or housed as required, especially in Upcountry. Nevertheless, several homes successfully implemented poultry farms and were able to obtain eggs for their use.

Some homes were about to engage the Department of Animal Production & Health Care, and get chicks and poultry feed at nominal costs. Further, the department came forward to provide veterinary care.

The improving economic conditions may ease some of the challanges associated with setting up poultry farms.

Supporting Sustainability

SMALL BUSINESS STARTUP / SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION



If a care home is interested in setting up a small business, LetUsHelpNow assists them with some seed funding or equipment. The opportunity is identified by and the business executed by the care home.

In 2022, we assisted Shakthi Girls Home (Batticaloa) with a business initiative. Shakthi Girls Home (Batticaloa) operates a small shop. The home noted that the locals go far to get water purified. They requested help to set up a water purification system, so that they can provide that service and earn an income. LetUsHelpNow requested quotes and provided LKR 300,000.00 to help implement the water purification system. Currently, they are generating income, which is going towards paying off the total cost. They will be generating profit from early this year.

Sri Lanka experienced long power cuts throughout 2022. The electricity prices more than doubled. As Sri Lanka is located close to the equator, solar panels are a good option to generate electricity.

LetUsHelpNow helped to implement solar panel installations at two care homes. This helped reduce expenses while providing electricity for some appliances such as lights and fans.




